“Launching programs in the Pavilion will be a major part of the next Festival over Easter 2014,” Four Winds Chair, Sheena Boughen said.

During the week, Andrew Constance MP, NSW Member for Bega also visited the site for a briefing on the building’s acoustics, which are funded by artsNSW through the NSW Department of Trade and Investment.

Mr Constance and Dr Kelly contributed to excavations by turning a sod or two.

Both commented on the significant and wide ranging voluntary contributions made to the development of this project and over \$1million raised from individuals and foundations.

Four Winds will start construction of the Pavilion later this month.
